The event: The save the Teifi walk is an event organised as a gathering of people who will be walking along a designated route from Llechryd Cricket Club to poppit Sands to highlight the problem of pollution in the river Teifi. It will culminate with activities on Poppit Sands. At all times it is up to the individuals who choose to take part in the event to accept responsibility for their own care and safety and that of any minors in their care. Participants will be given safety advice at the beginning of the walk which will point out the areas of safety that they need to be aware of. Participants will be reminded that dogs should be always kept on leads and are not allowed in the football ground but can go to the picnic area adjacent to the ground.
